

FRONTIER RED HAWKS GIRLS SECURE WIN OVER EAST HAMPTON EAGLES

AMHERST, MASS. -- The Frontier Red Hawks secured a 56-39 win over the East Hampton Eagles in day three of the Pioneer Valley Tip Off classic on Sunday.

The Red Hawks were led by Claire Kirkendall who scored 13 points, going 4-8 from the arc and grabbing eight rebounds. Skylar Steele tacked on 13 points going 5-7 from the field goal.

The Eagles were led by Samone Young recording a double-double on the morning with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

Breaking Down The Action

- The Red Hawks with an early 3-0 lead with a from behind the arc by Claire Kirkendall.
- Frontier garnered an early 6-1 run over three minutes keyed by Skylar Steele's fastbreak layup to extend their lead, 9-1 with 4:54 on the clock.
- Samone Young's jumper from beneath the net cut the Eagle deficit down to five but was quickly answered with a layup by Jazzlyn Hayes.
- With a couple shots from the charity stripe, East Hampton cut the Frontier lead, 11-6 going into the second quarter.
- Back-to-back triples by Frontier from Kirkendall and Steele two minutes into the second quarter extended their lead to double-digits.
- The Eagles found their rhythm with a 6-0 run for a score of 17-12 with 4:49 left in the half.
- A 10-2 run by Frontier over three minutes extended their lead with less than two minutes to play.
- At the halftime buzzer, Kyleigh Dorman's shot from behind the arc cut the East Hampton deficit, 28-17.
- Dorman connected on her second three-pointer of the morning just 17 seconds into the half.
- Both teams traded baskets with Steele fighting her way through traffic and finding the net bringing the Frontier lead, 32-20 with 5:46 left in the third.
- Off an inbound, Addie Harrington's contested shot from the arc extended the Red Hawks lead, 37-23.
- Frontier's hot streak continued with an 8-0 highlighted by a driving layup from Harrington.
- The Eagles snapped a near four minute scoring drought with a three from Nola Roos for a score of 43-26 with 2:08 left in the third.
- Kirkendall capped the third quarter with back to back threes before the buzzer to give Frontier a 52-28 advantage.
- East Hampton controlled the fourth outscoring the Red Hawks 11-4 capped by two shots from the charity line by Camilla Corsello for a final score of 56-39 in the favor of the Red Hawks.
