PITTSFIELD BOYS BEAT THE BUZZER AGAINST EASTLONGMEADOW

AMHERST, MASS. -- The Pittsfield Generals beat the buzzer against the Eastlongmeadow Spartans to take a 54-52 win.

The Generals were led by Kyle Cordoso with 14 points, including the decider with six rebounds and four assists.

The Spartans were led by Noah Enriques-Davis recording a game-high 18 points with five rebounds and three assists.

Breaking Down The Action

- Off a steal, Bri'Awn Thompson opened scoring for Pittsfield with a fastbreak layup 25 seconds into the game followed by a corner three from Prosper Ezan Jr.
- East Longmeadow answered immediately with a shot from the arc by Colin Maruca to cut the lead to 5-3.
- After falling behind, the Spartans tied the game at 8-8 with 3:47 in the quarter with a triple from Jack Serafini.
- A fastbreak layup by Freddy Conyers broke the tie and put the Generals up 10-8.
- Noah Kane-Smalls banked in a shot from the three to extend the Pittsfield lead.
- Before the end of the quarter, a three-point play by Noah Enriquez-Davis put the Spartans within two, 13-11.
- A 5-0 run keyed off a floater from Enriquez-Davis opened the scoring in the second quarter to give the Spartans a 16-13 lead.
- Kane-Smalls tied it up off a three with 4:55 left in the half.
- The two teams traded baskets highlighted by a baseline layup from Dom Rodriguez to give the Spartans a 23-20 advantage at the half.
- Jack Serafini opened second half with a three pointer to extend East Longmeadow's lead.
- Pittsfield responded with back-to-back layups and a midrange jumper by Ezan Jr. to tie the game with 5:30 on the clock.
- A 10-2 run over two minutes gave the Generals a 36-28 the lead with two minutes left in the third
- East Longmeadow's Enrique-Davis fought through traffic to break the Spartans scoring drought.
- With the help of layup and shot from the charity stripe, the Generals took a 39-30 advantage into the fourth.
- Both teams exchanged baskets to open the fourth quarter to keep the deficit at 46-36 in favor of Pittsfield.
- Brandon McCloud's post move cut the Generals lead to eight.
- The teams went shot for shot with the Spartans getting within three off a fastbreak layup from Rodriguez.
- After getting fouled, a three-point play from Billy Delaney tied the game with 16.7 seconds in regulation.

At the buzzer, a layup from Kyle Cardoso solidified the Generals win with a final score of 54-52.
